

Preventing Child Sexual Abuse by

Conclusion

 Some 1 in 6 children have been sexually abused by age 18 (more girls than boys)

8 out of 10 children know their abusers

 The vast majority of abuse is not reported to the Police


Who are the Abusers?

Working to Protect Children

A Comprehensive Framework for the Prevention of Child Sexual Abuse

Comprehensive Prevention model

- Four essential targets
 - **Offenders** / potential offenders
 - **Victims** / potential victims
 - Communities/Families
 - Specific situations in which abuse has occurred / is more likely to occur
- Public Health model of prevention
 - Primary prevention
 - Secondary prevention
 - Tertiary prevention
- Thus, 12 points of focus for prevention efforts (4 essential targets x 3 prevention levels)



Child sexual abuse is estimated to impact between one in four and one in ten children worldwide. Across the globe, countries are at different stages in recognising and responding to such abuse. The 'Eradicating Child Sexual Abuse' (ECSA) project involves developing a toolkit to assist nations looking to tackle child sexual abuse to develop a considered and credible strategy for its prevention.

What this project involves

The ECSA project will draw on the expertise of practitioners, academics and frontline workers responding to child sexual abuse to help develop the toolkit for people of all nations to use when looking to address child sexual abuse. We will run an online forum, convene meetings and host conferences with a view to:

- · Creating a comprehensive list of different 'types' of child sexual abuse, with definitions
- Creating a representative list of brief, accessible summaries of effective or promising primary, secondary and tertiary prevention responses to child sexual abuse
- Creating and trialling a step-by-step process for the design of a comprehensive strategy for the prevention of child sexual abuse by a nation/area/region
- Disseminating the prevention toolkit to organisations across the globe.

Across all our activities we will be using the 'Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Framework' developed by Prof Stephen Smallbone et al (1). This work is supported by Oak Foundation.

















