Letter from the Board

Dear partners, friends and supporters!

During 2010 we have repeatedly asked ourselves questions - what is our organization, what do we want to achieve and change in the next decade, which programs and services are still needed and which ones should we develop more, what should be our focus for the future? We are grateful that with the support and help of Save the Children Sweden expert Henk van Beers we have attempted to find answers to these questions through strategic planning. This process of asking and finding answers has helped us to define a strong emphasis on child participation.

2010 gave us opportunities to also learn from the best experiences and practices in other countries, through attending various important conferences, as well as organizing a field trip for a team of professionals working with abused children in various parts of Latvia to York, UK. This trip was possible through a partnership project with Latvia Probation Office and collaboration with experienced expert from UK Nigel King.

Much effort was placed in developing a new web page www. bernskacietusais.lv, that serves as a web resource center for professionals, students and parents around the issues of child abuse, child as a victim or witness of crime. We continued the work of educating and training professionals in the field of child protection, education, health care and law enforcement on the issues of child abuse, resilience, and child as a victim of crime. Especially important was the in-depth training program for police that we are able to conduct in partnership with Oak Foundation and State police.

We were glad that we were able to begin addressing one of the problems for the professionals working with the problem of child abuse in Latvia – the lack of professional literature related to the issue. We published a Manual for professionals working with the problem of child abuse, and we plan to keep working in this direction in the future, as well.

By the end of 2010 we were able to bring into existence one of our dreams we have been carrying in our hearts for a long time – establishing of a Honorary Advisory Board of Center Dardedze. We are grateful for respectable people, such as our former president Mrs. Vaira Vike – Freiberga, and others who are willing to share their tremendous knowledge and experiences with us in advising our work. We are proud to have our "own" prosecutor, doctor, pastor, researchers, social anthropologist, and a number of experts representing social and psychological field. We appreciate the contribution of our Advisory Honorary board who helps us look at our work from a different perspective and guides us with their precious advice.

We are happy for every child and family we have met this year giving us opportunity to touch their lives and giving us back in so many ways – through teaching, guiding and letting us see changes in their lives.

I am thankful to each and every staff member and every partner for the accomplishments of this year, allowing us to believe that the work we are doing together is making a difference in our children's lives.

Center Against Abuse "Dardedze"

Center Against Abuse "Dardedze" is a non-governmental, nonprofit organization working to prevent child abuse in Latvia and to provide direct help to children exposed to sexual, physical, emotional abuse and neglect.

Our vision and mission is planted in the belief that every child has the right to feel safe, to be loved, cared for, nurtured and respected. Therefore the professional team of our center works towards enhancing:

- child's safety and protection at home (in the family)
- child's safety and protection at school
- child's safety and protection in residential placements
- child's safety on line

• child's safety in community

We actively work towards preventing child abuse in all levels, and provide support and help when child abuse occurs.

We believe that by emphasizing public opinion, educating society and by early identification of high risk and early intervention providing help to families with children at risk, we can prevent child abuse and protect our children from all forms of violence.



Helping abused children and families

Since the first day of Center "Dardedze" one of the main tasks has been to provide assistance to children who have been victims of sexual, physical, emotional abuse and neglect. Initially our Center ran a shelter support program for children who were removed from their families due to abuse, as well as out-patient counseling services. The Shelter program was closed several years ago, but we still continue to work with children and families both to process trauma caused by abuse and to provide every possible support to this family, as well as work in a preventive manner to provide support to families where there is a high risk of child abuse.

Depending on each case, we work either with individual, family or group approach for assessment or therapeutic purposes, with sand therapy, play therapy, theraplay, etc.

Our team of professionals - social workers, psychologists, psychotherapist, vocational therapist, art therapist always works using multi disciplinary approach, engaging all responsible parties for the best outcome of the case that would be in the best interests and needs of a child.

Child abuse prevention program "Džimba safety program"



Džimba safety program:

• Child focused program for reducing child victimization

• Every child should receive instructions on personal safety that are positive, comprehensive and effective

• Every parent and educator should receive support and guidelines on how to teach personal safety to their children

The goals of the program are:

- To enhance a child's ability to avoid victimization
- To enhance a child's self esteem
- To reduce the feelings of guilt and blame that often are associated with victimization
- To promote disclosure of abuse and victimization
- To enhance and coordinate community response
- To enhance communication between parents and children about personal safety
- To reinforce adult supervision and protection
- To deter offender behavior

Center "Dardedze" runs various activities under the Safety program: Džimba Safety lesson in kindergartens, Džimba Safety 9 step program in kindergartens, Džimba Safety trip for 1st -3rd grade students and their teachers, Džimba Safety Summer schools for children, Džimba Safety parent workshops and special Safety information web site www.dzimba.lv.

The idea of Džimba Safety program was developed gradually with growing understanding of the importance of prevention programs that would address children about their personal safety, at the same time addressing adults – parents and teachers about their responsibility in safeguarding children.

The special character was developed in joint efforts with children who was named Džimba. He now lives in Latvia in a Safety House, teaching children and adults the Safety rules in relationship with both strangers and especially people whom we know, with adults and peers.

Various activities from Džimba Safety program has been ran for more than 6 years now. Here are some quotes from the feedback received after attending and learning about the program:

A 2nd grade teacher from Riga Plavnieku Elementary school: "The Safety trip was fabulous! Children were captured by the educational adventure. It was a real school of life that taught children to stop and think weather the situation they are engaging in is safe or not. Great job! I gained knowledge that I never even had for myself!"

A child who was randomly interviewed by Latvian Radio on the street asked about his most memorable event of the year: "I remember the most the Safety trip where I met Džimba and learned about my personal safety! I want to go back and take part in the program again!"

A parent attending Džimba Safety workshop for parents: "I was shocked that no one had ever talked to me about my personal safety when I was a child, therefore I never knew how to teach that to my own children. This workshop has empowered me as a parent to do everything possible to protect my child".

A principle from Lauberes elementary school in Ogre region: "I am so thankful for the opportunity to bring this unique Safety program to the kindergarten students of our school and have our staff trained in applying it. It is so rare that programs like this are available also to the schools in rural areas. I am glad that through this program our country side children can feel safer and realize that they cannot completely trust every person they meet on their way."

Džimba Safety lessons in kindergartens

This is a 30 – 40 minute long interactive lesson in kindergartens where a trainer teaches children the lesson of "My body is MINE" safety rule. During the interactive activities children learn the difference between a safe and unsafe touching, about the things that can be kept in secret and things that shouldn't be kept in secret. The main goal of the lesson is to help children identify adults whom they can trust and tell if someone touches them inappropriately, and to encourage them not to keep it in a secret. After the lesson kindergarten teacher receives a folder of materials that can be used in the further work with children to refresh their knowledge of the personal safety issues.

Goal of the program:

To provide safety knowledge and skills to kindergarten children and teachers about the Safe and Unsafe touch and how to act if anyone uses unsafe touch in relationship with children



Džimba Safety program in pre- schools - 9 step pilot program

In 2009 Center "Dardedze" developed a 9 step preventive educational program to be applied in 24 kindergartens and child care institutions in Latvia. There were 24 professionals trained who became Safety trainers and carried out the 9 step program in their work places. In 2010 16 of the trained staff of kindergartens and care centers continued implementing the Džimba Safety trip program in their everyday work reaching new children and parents. One 40 minute safety lesson was included in the regular pre-school curricula during the 9 week period every week. Parents were informed with a special letter every week, introducing them with the Safety issues children have learned during the week and giving them special home work to be completed together with children. Knowledge on children's safety was tested before and after program. After the completion of the program 87% of children could recognize potentially dangerous situations, knowing how they should act in these situations.

Program facts:



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Džimbas Safety Trip for 1st – 3rd grade students is a 3 hour interactive adventure during which children learn 8 personal safety rules that are important in reducing the risk of these children to become victims of violence. During the program children go through 4 interactive stations, learning the key factors of safety in relationships with peers, adults, strangers and people whom they know. This program also involves teachers and parents with a purpose to continue the discussion with children after the program.

This program helps children recognize abuse, teaches how to be safe and where to look for help when they are exposed to violence and/or abuse.

The knowledge of all the program participants is assessed before they attend the Safety trip program, as well as after 1 month and after 6 months to 1 year after children have attended to program. The results show that children's knowledge change dramatically after attending the program. When children were asked if they would go and help a strange person to find the lost kitten, 87% of children said that they would go and help before attending the program. After the program 89.17% children gave the correct answer, stating that they would not go and would tell and adult they trusted about it.

It is a 4 day interactive prevention program for children 4 – 8 years old, involving their parents. This program is a fun, interactive way to learn Safety rules in relationships with other people – adults, peers, strangers and also persons children know well.

The core principals of the program are:

1. Children have the rights to be safe

Children learn what personal safety is and that they have the right to be safe.


2. There are some fundamental principles underlying all activities we do with the children and adults in Safety program

a) Children learn to identify deceptive behavior (it's not what people look like, their age or how well you know them – it's what they ask you to do that is important.

b) Restore instincts and feelings (how to trust and act upon their feelings and instincts)

c) Builds self confidence (if they feel valuable, they feel worthy of being safe)

Džimba Parent's Club – child safety workshops for parents

At the end of 2010 we added a new component to Džimba Safety program and it it's called Džimba Parent's Club. We organize parent's workshops once a month where parents are welcomed to come together and learn more about how they can protect their children, what they can teach their children, as well as how to become the best moms and dads possible for their children. These workshops soon became very popular and now there is already an established core group of parents who have become strong supporters of the child safety issue and have become Parent Ambassadors of the Džimba Safety program.

Web resource on Child Safety – www.dzimba.lv

Since 2007 we have ran a child safety web resource www.dzimba. Iv for 3 target groups – children, parents and professionals. During the last years it has become rather popular among children as well as adults. It provides interactive tools to communicate child personal safety issues to children in a playful, non-threatening way, giving opportunity to both parents and teachers initiate dialogue with children about their safety.







Courage to be friendly – anti bullying program

This is a special program designed to help schools and other child related institutions and organizations to build child friendly environment, develop anti-bullying policy and intervention plan in case bullying takes place. This program involves students, schools' staff and parents. Courage to be friendly was started and still remains as a part of the "Friends Across the boarders" project started by Save the Children Sweden to be carried out in all three Baltic States – Latvia, Lithuania and Estonia, giving each country the freedom to design the program according to individual needs and challenges.

Courage to be friendly activities in 2010:

- Special 40 minute "Courage to be friendly" sessions held in 224 classroom auditoriums, reaching 4119 students in the 5th 9th grade age group. At the end of each session students report what they have understood from this session filling in a text message that they would write to a friend who missed a class. 85% of students who attended Courage to be friendly session state that it had helped them understand what bullying really is and that they can do something to stop it.
- During 2010 Dardedze was able to lobby the mandatory requirement for each school to have a policy for anti bullying work in their schools in order to protect students from bullying in schools. Dardedze provides assistance to schools in developing anti bullying plan and plan for intervention in cases of school bullying.
- Established representatives of "Courage to be friendly" student network in order to sustain the anti bullying activities and work in schools.
- Courage to be friendly competition for schools took place in April. 37 schools with 44 classes and 1083 students took part in the competition sharing the work they do in their schools of prevent bullying. The most active class received a prize – trip to Stockholm to get acquainted with the anti-bullying work in schools of Stockholm and attend "Friends" day in one of the largest parks of Stockholm.
- Students of Courage be friendly to network developed special postcards with the anti bullying to message be distributed to their peers to motivate them not to remain indifferent to the problem.



- Program web site www.drosmedraudzeties.lv is used to reach students, teachers and parents with the latest information on bullying, as well as to provide a way to communicate the problem and look for help.
- There were therapeutic assistance provided in 17 cases of bullying, as well as 43 online counseling provided to students writing and asking about their situations of bullying.
- A summer camp called "Friendship recipes" was held in July with the participants of Courage to be friendly student network. Unique calendar for schools "Friendship recipes" was created by camp participants that was published and then distributed among Courage to be friendly schools in Latvia.
- A social campaign "Friendship Day" was organized as a special day on November 12th with a purpose of addressing students to pay special attention to tolerance and friendship towards each other. For a whole week in November students could send in a photo of their class and a statement that they proclaim their class as a Friendly and Tolerant class. All the photos afterwards were joined in one collage of Friendship Day. Campaign was well reflected in TV, Radio and electronic media.
- Courage to be friendly program was implemented in 4 boarding schools of Latvia, helping the schools to develop Anti bullying policy and working with the school staff and students together.
- Special teacher and parent workshops were organized once a month on the subject of bullying September – November with 92 participants all together.

Child abuse prevention and early intervention program for families at risk with young children "Guardian angel"



Program "Guardian angel" – community based prevention program for young parents with children 0-3 years old. This program is for new parents (parents at risk), providing education in child development, parent and child relationships, and adult relationships; information on community

resources; and enhancing parent-child bonding and attachment. The main goal is early intervention and prevention of child abuse in these families.

Program's Guardian angel goal is to create a support system for new families where young parents come from orphanages, or are families that are in high social risk situations and are expecting baby or parenting a young child.

The program was re-designed in 2009 putting a much larger emphasis on individual support to young parents at risk, as well as on engaging local community in supporting these parents. In this program we are involving volunteers from community to train them to become support persons for high risk families with children. Every year we work with young mothers who have graduated from orphanages or residential placements and do not know how to be the best moms for their children due to the lack of knowledge and personal experience.

We not only provide them professional assistance, but also pair them up with a trained volunteer from community who then becomes informal help and support to this family - being a role model, friend and support in the most difficult time of this family's life, almost like a "Guardian angel". Volunteers are regularly trained, supervised, monitored and supported by professional staff to ensure healthy relationship between all parties.

This is an important program for the whole community, because it is an example of good practice showing how the community itself can get involved in empowering and strengthening its families for the safe and healthy childhood of its children.



To assist parents we also produce special materials for them. In 2010 we produced a small book for parents called "I can help you" where information to parents are provided from a young child's perspective, guiding them in the main areas of safeguarding young children.

Pathways to competence



This is parent support group program for parents of children 0 – 7 years old with the aim to reduce child abuse risk in these families. There are 2 groups per year with up to 15 parents in each of them. Groups meet once a week for 10 weeks with 2 group trainers, discussing such topics as child development, understanding the needs of a child, nonviolent disciplining,

building attachment, playing with your child, family traditions, etc. At the same time special group for children is held as well, were children learn positive communication skills and problem solving. The purpose of this group is to train parents to reduce risk of child abuse in these families. Families are referred either by social services, schools, and hospitals or may sign up themselves.

The topics of the program are:

- 1. Understanding early child development and temperament.
- 2. Helping children develop body control and positive body image.
- 3. Developing a secure attachment.
- 4. Encouraging play and imagination.
- 5. Encouraging language and communication.
- 6. Laying a foundation for positive self esteem.
- 7. Disciplining to encourage self regulation, morality and a sense of conscience.
- 8. Encouraging emotional regulation.
- 9. Encouraging concentration, planning and problem solving.
- 10. Encouraging social competence, empathy and caring behavior.

Child as a witness or victim of crime

Since year 2001 we are also active in providing support to children who are involved in criminal proceedings as witnesses or victims of crime. We have often faced the situations where children have been severely traumatized by involvement in criminal proceedings due to the lack of consideration of children having special needs when being involved in this proceeding. We provide trainings for law enforcement professionals – police, prosecutors and judges dealing with cases involving children. We have also been active in lobbying changes in legislation allowing video interviewing of children in friendly environment and then considering that as a legal evidence in the criminal proceedings that would protect children who have already been traumatized.

Our Center was one of the first ones in Baltic States establishing Child friendly forensic interview room, were child was interviewed in the presence of psychologist reducing the anxiety and traumatization level of a child. We also provide supportive services to the child and the family, becoming representatives of a case in the court, giving our testimonies of the interactions with the child that can be helpful during the proceedings.

We have also carried out various campaigns and activities to raise public awareness of the issue, as well as build capacity of professionals involved in interactions with children, emphasizing the sensitivity and need of a child friendly approach.

In 2010 we were able to provide support in 64 such cases.

In 2010 Center has developed a special web resource www. bernskacietusais.lv that serves as a resource for professionals involved in working with children who are victims or witnesses of a crime, as well as to families, parents, social workers and teachers with theoretical and very practical information related to the issue of child as a victim or witness of a crime.



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Sexual Abuse against Children at Residential Institutions

Childhood without abuse – towards a better child protection system in Eastern Europe

This project is being implemented in 6 countries simultaneously. The coordinator of this project is the Nobody's Children Foundation in Poland. Project activities are aimed at improving the child protection system in Easter Europe. The major goal of this project is to improve the competencies of professionals working with children exposed to violence and abuse, as well as to raise general public's sensitivity to the problem of child abuse.

The specific objectives of the program include:

- Educating the society, broadening public knowledge about prevention of child abuse and neglect, and empowering intervention opportunities;
- Changing the attitudes of parents and caregivers associated with child rearing and child protection;
- Diagnosing attitudes, knowledge and skills of Eastern Europe's professionals working with abused children and improving their competencies through training programs, supervisions, site visits, publications and research;
- Developing regional standards and solutions in the field of child abuse and neglect based on proven strategies used in other countries and by more experienced organizations participating in the project.
- Lobbying for the introduction of legislative amendments necessary for changing and implementing social policies that would ensure effective child protection

The project involves the following activities:

• Social campaigns

- Lobbying in favor of legislative changes and building an integrated child support system;
- Publishing educational materials addressed to professionals, parents and children
- Organizing conferences, training sessions, supervisions and site visits;
- Conducting research on social attitudes towards child abuse;

For these 4 years the main priority topics of the project are: child sexual abuse, child witness and supporting families with young children.

Helping abused children and preventing child abuse in Latvia (Violence prevention)

Specific objectives of the project:

- 1. To train up to 30 parents of young children in non abusive parenting approaches through a specially designed 10 step program "Pathways to competence"
- 2. Provide support for additional clients in the situation of child abuse or high risk situations
- 3. To involve local community in providing support to young high risk families with young children thus reducing the risk of child abuse in these families
- 4. To enable center "Dardedze" to function and run its preventive and therapeutic programs in times of financial recession in the country.

Child as a victim or witness in Criminal proceedings

Specific objectives of the project:

- 1. To promote integrated action of the institutions involved in investigation and court procedures, when child is involved in the criminal proceedings as a victim or witness of crime.
- 2. To protect the best interests of the child involved in criminal proceedings and to promote the renewal of his/her life quality.
- 3. To develop guidelines and standards of child friendly interviewing; as well as adapt and absorb theses guidelines and standards into practice.

Involving volunteers in improving child safeguarding in families

Specific objectives of the project:

- 1. Based on the best volunteering practices in the world, to develop a volunteer system in Latvia to provide in formal support to families with young children in crises.
- 2. To recruit and train 50 volunteers in providing support to up to 100 children in crises families.
- 3. To develop a NGO and municipality partnership model in implementing the volunteer informal support to families program.
- 4. To train 16 volunteer mentors/supervisors who would provide assistance to support to volunteers in working with the families.

Campaign "I have the right not to be afraid!"

This campaign was initiated by our Polish partner organization "Nobody's children foundation" and implemented in terms of the project "Childhood without Abuse – towards a better child protection system in Eastern Europe" 2nd stage.

Campaign "I have the right not to be afraid" was mainly addressing professionals dealing with children as victims or witnesses of crime during the criminal procedures – police officers, prosecutors and judges, as well as the representatives of children – psychologists and parents.

During campaign there were special posters and leaflets produced with the Charter of the rights of child victim" produced and distributed to the target audience through trainings, partnerships and other important events.

During campaign we also produced a special web page www.bernskacietusais.lv where professionals and parents can find useful information regarding this topic.

Campaign "Courage to be friendly"

In 2010 we were able to continue what we started a year before and organize a special campaign "Courage to be friendly" to address the issues of bullying in school. This campaign was also formed around child participation where they participated in sending in the photos of their class and description why they are the friendliest class. At the end of campaign all the photos where combined in one joint photo collage as a hand for friendship. Issue of bullying was addressed in media as well as in different activities in schools organized by children themselves.


